The burner is without smoke, is odorless and cannot be extinguished by gales.

The motor transmits its power, by durable, noiseless gear, direct to the rear axle. Sprocket wheels and chains have been discarded.

The machinery is mounted in a strong steel tubular frame, independent of all woodwork.




